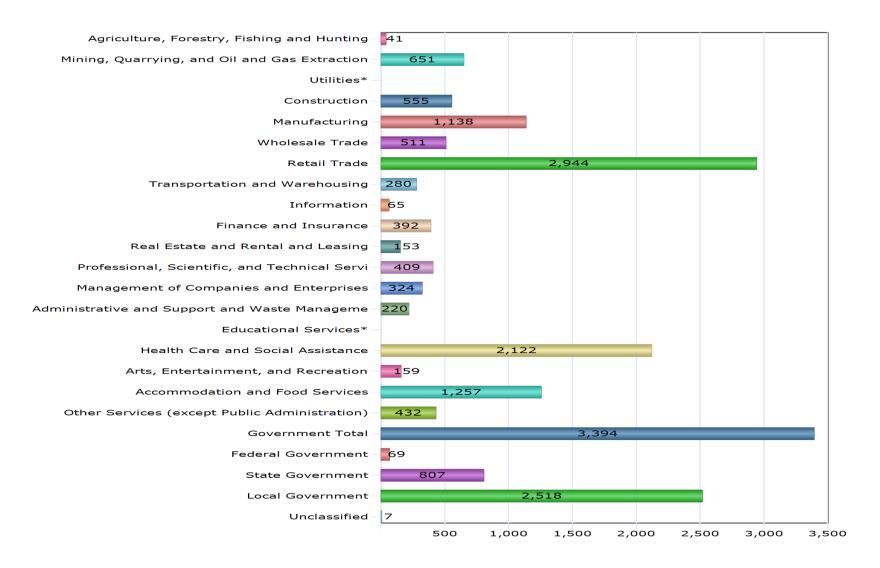

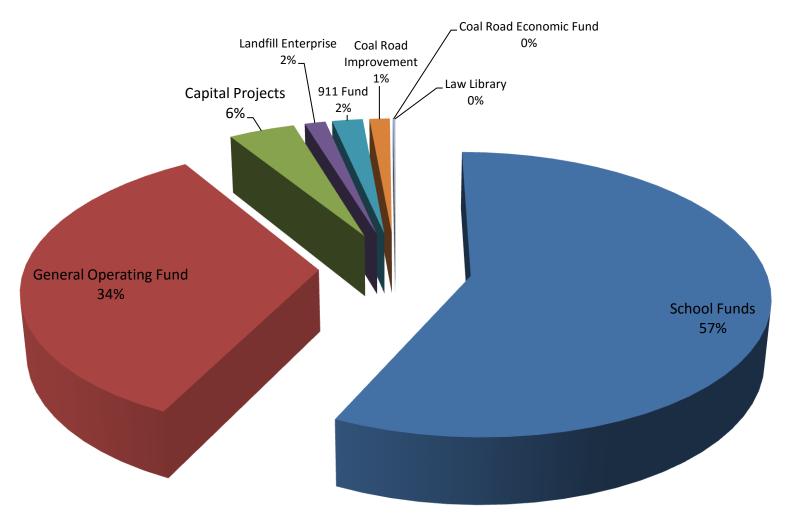

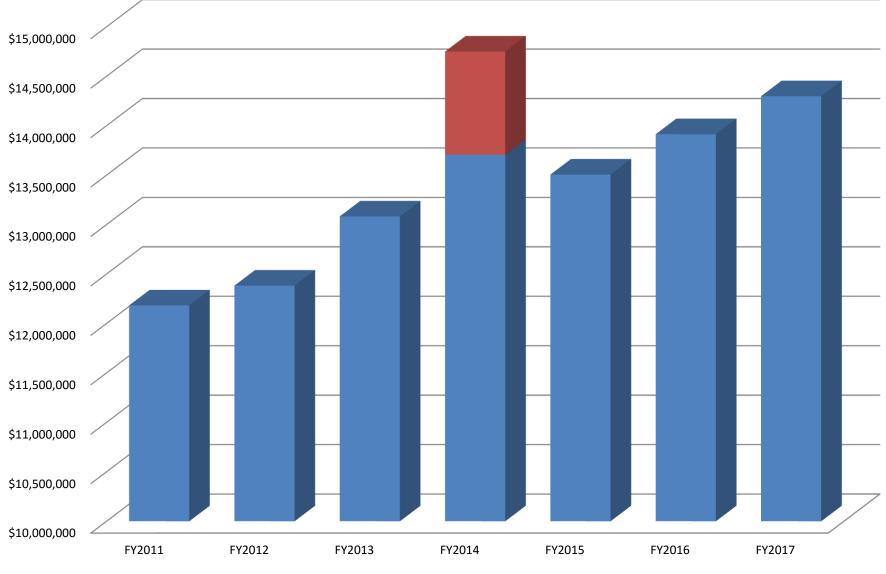
FY17 Proposed Expenditures



School Funding

- Virginia requires a local match to receive their funding for schools
- FY17 required local match for schools is \$11,438,991
- Tazewell County gives 25% more than required or \$14,298,738 for FY17
- \$2,859,747 more than required match.
- \$384,063 increase from FY16 funds (2.76% increase)

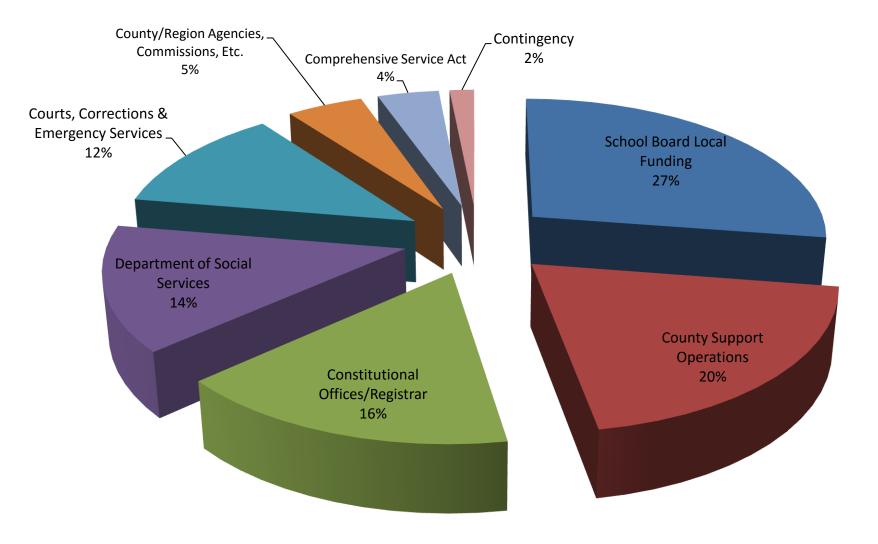

Budget Reductions to General Fund

- Reduced or eliminated new vehicle purchases for Building Inspection, Engineering, Animal Control & Sheriff
- Delayed all 2% salary increases until December, 2016
- Across the board 15% reduction to all postage, office supply, travel & training accounts
- Changed to a self insured hospitalization plan for employees
- Reduction to capital outlay, machinery & equipment, furniture & fixture accounts
- No increases to human services agencies, no new requests added.
- Eliminated 2 Department Head positions (unfilled)
- Reduced District Fund accounts

District Funds used for Schools

- From July 1, 2014 through April 30, 2016
 \$317,330 has been given to Tazewell County schools/groups from Board members district funds.
- The money went to various school related activities, boosters, project graduations, field trips, sports teams, bands, Model GA, FCCLA, DECA, Jr. ROTC, etc.
