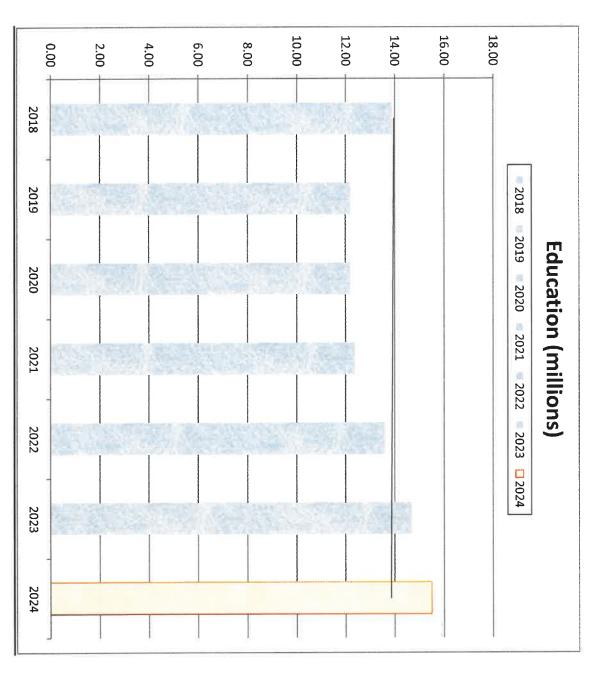
Tazewell County Average Real Property Assessment Increase 2023 22%

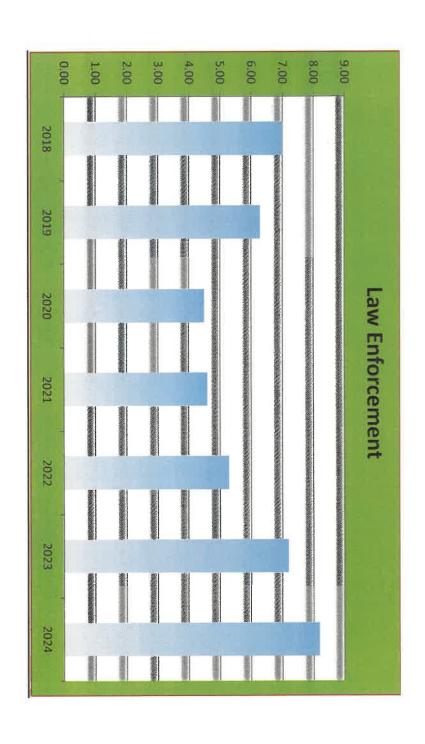

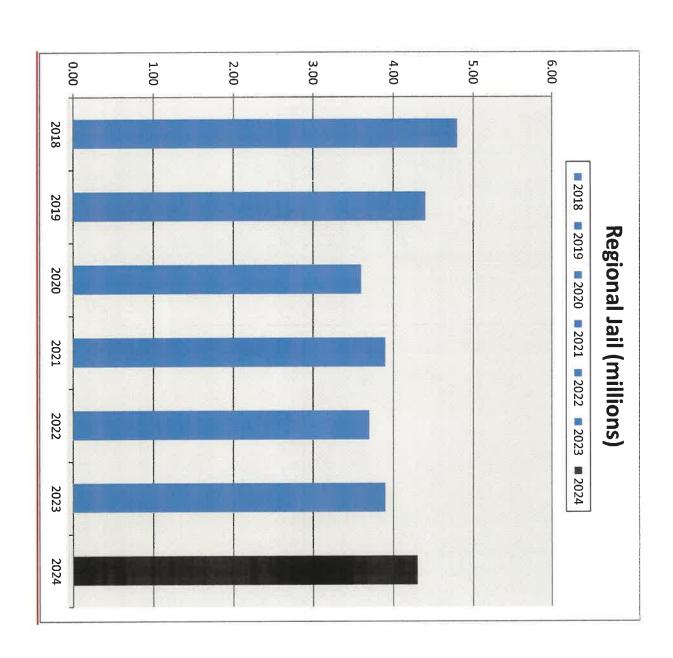

# Top Expenses for Tazewell County Since FY 2018



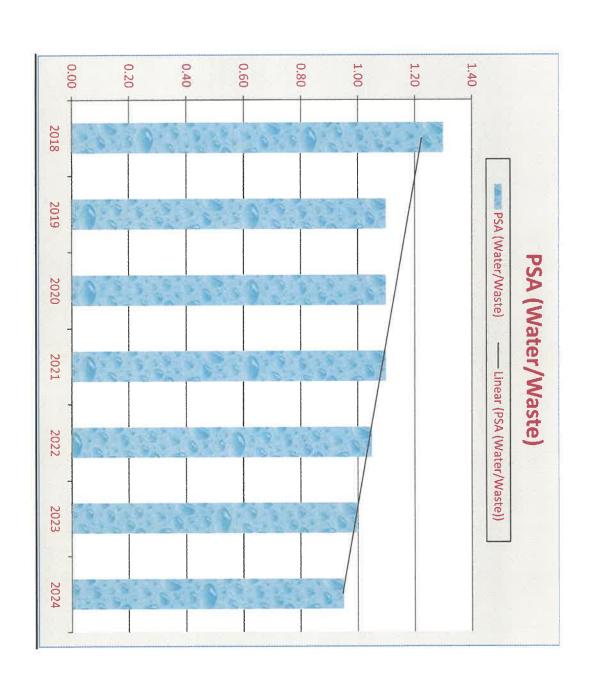

#### Social Services (DSS&CSA)

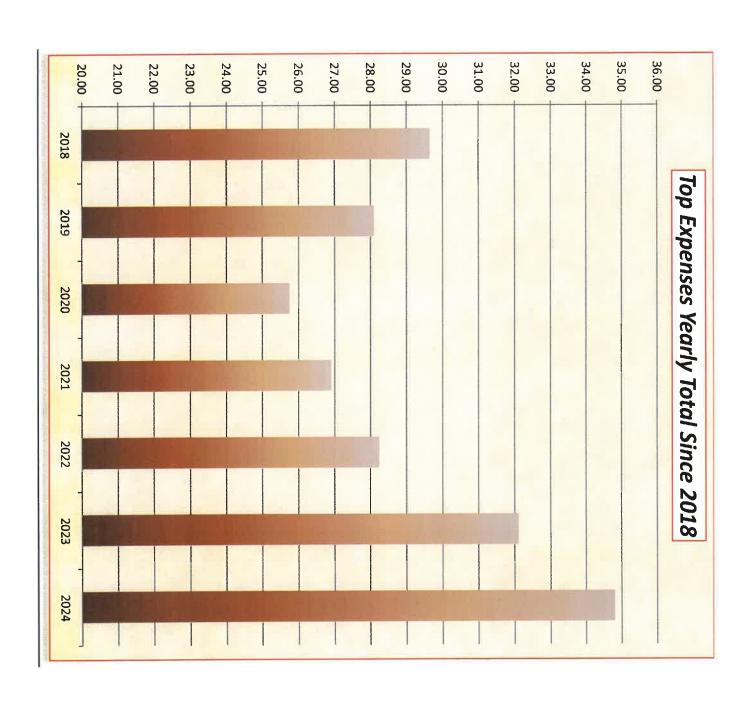

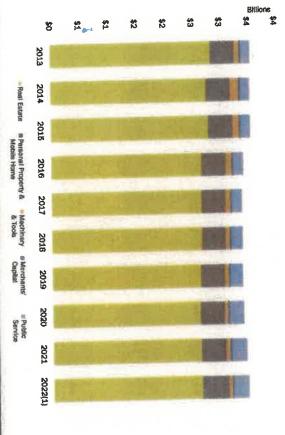
