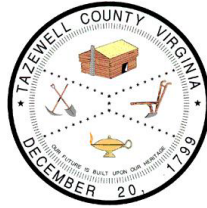

MINUTES

Chairman, Andy Hrovatic called the regular meeting to order and presided with all other members present.

Supervisor Presley led The Pledge of Allegiance to the United States flag followed by the invocation given by Supervisor Cruey.

Chairman Hrovatic welcomed those in attendance and citizens who were participating by conference call. Citizens were able to call in and participate in the meeting by calling (425) 436-6388 and entering the access code 836650.

AGENDA APPROVED AS AMENDED

The Chairperson called for any additions to the agenda.

Chase Collins, County Attorney, noted that a revised agenda contains several additional items to be addressed in the meeting.

Upon motion of Supervisor Plaster, seconded by Supervisor Presley and adopted by a vote of 5 to 0, with all members present and voting in favor thereof and no one against the same, the Tazewell County Board of Supervisors approved the November 7, 2024 amended agenda with additions/deletions, a copy of which is available at the County Administration Office, 197 Main Street, Tazewell, Virginia 24651.

MINUTES APPROVED AS WRITTEN

Upon motion of Supervisor Presley, seconded by Supervisor Plaster and adopted by a vote of 5 to 0, with all members present and voting in favor thereof and no one against the same, the Tazewell County Board of Supervisors hereby approves the minutes from the October 1, 2024 meeting. Upon motion of Supervisor Gillespie seconded by Supervisor Cruvey and adopted by a vote of 5 to 0 with all members present and voting in favor thereof and no one against the same, the Tazewell County Board of Supervisors hereby approves amending Item D of the Consent Calendar to read “Ratify poll for a \$50,000.00 advancement to Mercer County, West Virginia landfill to pay for diverted waste from the Tazewell County landfill”.

Mr. Collins spoke regarding Item F, stating that Mr. Murray is a family member and preferred to leave the decision up to the Board.

Supervisor Gillespie asked to remove Item G for a separate vote, stating he feels he has a conflict with the company in question.

Upon motion of Supervisor Gillespie seconded by Supervisor Presley and adopted by a vote of 5 to 0 with all members present and voting in favor thereof and no one against the same, the Tazewell County Board of Supervisors hereby approves Consent Calendar Items A through F, and the Warrants as amended. DEPARTMENT REPORTS

Coronado update

Mr. Harwood, Director of engineering for Coronado presented information regarding current and future mining plans and explained how Tazewell County will benefit from the coal severance tax.

DAR resolution

Upon motion of Supervisor Gillespie, seconded by Supervisor Presley and adopted by a vote of 5 to 0, with all members present and voting in favor thereof and no one against the same, the Tazewell County Board of Supervisors hereby approves a resolution to the DAR. Capital Waste

A representative of Capital Waste Management addressed the Board and introduced a new employee who will be managing landfill operations.

Engineering – Kenneth Dunford

Mr. Dunford advised that roughly 6.5 acres of the new landfill cell will be ready for use by Thanksgiving, according to information provided to him by Republic.

Mr. Dunford pointed out an error in his report. He stated he is asking for funds to pay Bland/Wythe JTPSA for their diversion of waste to NRV landfill in the amount of \$4,370.97.

Upon motion of Supervisor Hrovatic, seconded by Supervisor Presley and adopted by a vote of 5 to 0, with all members present and voting in favor thereof and no one against the same, the Tazewell County Board of Supervisors hereby approves \$4,370.97 to pay BWJPSA for diversion of waste to Bland/Wythe landfill.

Mr. Accurso shared information about SBA assistance available following the recent storm event.

Kathy Joy-Brosius - FEMA

Ms. Brosius introduced herself and shared information about the FEMA DRC site and the services offered at the site.

School facilities

Upon motion of Supervisor Plaster, seconded by Supervisor Presley and adopted by a vote of 5 to 0, with all members present and voting in favor thereof and no one voting against the same, the Tazewell County Board of Supervisors hereby approves (1) ratification of the Board's previous resolution support financing of new school construction and find each of the following firms qualified: (a) Thompson & Litton; (b) LPA and (c) SEH and (2) that the Board issue a letter to TCPS requesting that all parties proceed with future procurement for school construction.

Property acquisition

Veterans Parade

Mr. Wicks asked for funding for the Tazewell Veterans Day parade.

Upon motion of Supervisor Hrovatic, seconded by Supervisor Gillespie and adopted by a vote of 5 to 0, with all members present and voting in favor thereof and no one voting against the same, the Tazewell County Board of Supervisors hereby approves funding of the Tazewell County Veterans Parage (to be paid to Tazewell Torday for the purpose of expenses for the parade). Outside Dreams

Howie Mitchell, Tazewell, a representative of Outside Dreams, asked to be granted non-profit local tax-exempt status for 197 acres being used in connection with their existing business which cares for disabled individuals. He stated the property will be used for taking disabled individuals safely into nature.

Mr. Collins pointed out that a public hearing is necessary prior to making the tax-exempt determination and asked that the documentation provided by Mr. Mitchell be made a part of these minutes.

Upon motion of Supervisor Gillespie, seconded by Supervisor Presley and adopted by a vote of 5 to 0, with all members present and voting in favor thereof and no one voting against the same, the Tazewell County Board of Supervisors hereby approves holding a public hearing to gather public comment regarding the tax-exempt request from Outside Dreams.

ADMINISTRATIVE/FINANCIAL/COUNTY PROJECTS UPDATE

Consider extending State of Emergency

County Administrator, Eric Young, announced that county officials are still evaluating damages caused by the recent storm and asked that the state of emergency be extended until December 3, 2024.

Upon motion of Supervisor Plaster, seconded by Supervisor Presley and adopted by a vote of 5 to 0, with all members present and voting in favor thereof and no one voting against the same, the Tazewell County Board of Supervisors hereby approves extending the state of emergency until December 3, 2024.

Storm recovery update

Damage estimates

Private damage

Mr. Young shared slides depicting estimated damages to private agricultural property in the county at approximately \$10m.

He stated that 129 homes reported damage, with 15 of those homes receiving major damage or were destroyed. He reported that to date, approximately 1580 residents have made contact with FEMA online or at the Disaster Recovery Center inside the Administration Building.

Public damage

Mr. Young announced that the PSA suffered approximately \$249,000.00 in damages.

Mr. Young stated that damage to county property included the animal shelter (\$4K), courthouse roof (\$15K), fire department equipment (\$12K), Fire Department building damage (\$6K), the Morris Knob power line (\$10K), county road damage (\$20K), TCSO roof (\$4K) and damage to the liner in the new cell at the landfill (\$300K), modification of split cell (\$150K). He said damage to the liner at the new landfill is the biggest expense

in addition to approximately \$300,000.00 in construction and change order costs. He advised that there may be some FEMA funding to cover some of those repairs.

He stated there will be a loss of revenue from the diversion of waste from Wythe and Bland Counties because Tazewell County won't be receiving approximately \$280,000.00 from that source as it otherwise would have received.

Mr. Young advised that the current leachate line can only handle approximately 16,000 gallons per day and the extraordinary amount of rain during the storm forced us to have to pay for the excess leachate to be hauled to Bluefield, West Virginia at a cost of \$282,000.00, a portion which is reimbursable from FEMA.

Budget amendment request

Mr. Young outlined some unexpected revenue the county has had in 2025, which will help with the need for additional funds. He detailed unexpected refunds from the regional jail and state Department of Health, as well as higher than expected revenues from machinery and tools taxes and Bristol Casino. Nevertheless, he asked for \$600,000.00. He said he is hesitant to dip solely into the reserve account, ultimately asking for \$300,000.00 from reserves and \$300,000.00 from contingency. He advised that a large portion of the damages are reimbursable by FEMA and VDEM but the time frame for that is as long as two years; therefore, he asked the Board to "cash flow" the storm related expenses.

Mr. Young asked for a supplemental appropriation amendment to the current budget to account for the additional revenues and additional in the amount of \$600,000.00 for the following:

Mr. Young stated there should be no requirement to advertise this amendment because it is under the threshold for doing so. Although not included in the proposed supplemental appropriation, he strongly suggested purchasing a stormwater pump and a second leachate tank in FY26.

Supervisor Cruey inquired as to whether the additional money can come from the TCPS school facilities fund. Mr. Young advised it would be permissible to do so but TCPS might need to use that money themselves in light of the unknown damages the school buildings might have sustained as a result of the storm. Mr. Young also suggested *not* taking the entire amount from contingency since its so early in the budget year.

Upon motion of Supervisor Hrovatic, seconded by Supervisor Presley and adopted by a vote of 5 to 0, with all members present and voting in favor thereof and no one voting against the same, the Tazewell County Board of Supervisors hereby approves the proposed FY25 Supplemental Budget Amendment as presented except that \$300,000.00 will be taken from contingency and only \$300,000.00 will be taken from reserves.

Landfill update

Construction Update

Mr. Young advised that the portion of the new cell left unscathed by the storm is projected to be ready by Thanksgiving.

Upon motion of Supervisor Plaster, seconded by Supervisor Presley and adopted by a vote of 5 to 0, with all members present and voting in favor thereof and no one voting against the same, the Tazewell County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the County Administrator to request an expedited review of the landfill construction permit from DEQ.

Authorize County Administrator to request expedited review/inspection of landfill construction from DEQ

Upon motion of Supervisor Plaster, seconded by Supervisor Presley and adopted by a vote of 5 to 0, with all members present and voting in favor thereof and no one voting against the same, the Tazewell County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the County Administrator to request an expedited review of the landfill from DEQ.

Authorize County Administrator to request expedited review of permit modification

Upon motion of Supervisor Cruely, seconded by Supervisor Gillespie and adopted by a vote of 5 to 0, with all members present and voting in favor thereof and no one voting against the same, the Tazewell County Board of Supervisors hereby approves a resolution authorizing the County Administrator to request expedited review of the permit modification, allowing the landfill to open the first portion of the cell.

Diversion Update

Ratify poll approving deposit at Mercer County Landfill

Upon motion of Supervisor Hrovatic, seconded by Supervisor Plaster and adopted by a vote of 5 to 0, with all members present and voting in favor thereof and no one voting against the same, the Tazewell County Board of Supervisors hereby ratifies a poll approving a deposit of \$50,000.00 to the Mercer County, West Virginia landfill for the months of October and November.

Ratify diversion of municipal solid waste to Mercer County Landfill effective October 7, 2024

Upon motion of Supervisor Cruely, seconded by Supervisor Presley and adopted by a vote of 5 to 0, with all members present and voting in favor thereof and no one voting against the same, the Tazewell County Board of Supervisors hereby ratifies a poll granting the County Administrator the authority to divert municipal solid waste from Tazewell County landfill to Mercer County, West Virginia landfill.

Ratify diversion of commercial solid waste from Tazewell County Landfill

Upon motion of Supervisor Cruely, seconded by Supervisor Presley and adopted by a vote of 5 to 0, with all members present and voting in favor thereof and no one voting against the same, the Tazewell County Board of Supervisors hereby ratifies a poll granting the County Administrator the authority to divert commercial solid waste from Tazewell County landfill if he deems diversion necessary

Mr. Young stated that commercial solid waste has not yet been diverted because the County receives revenue from commercial solid waste disposal.

Consider ratifying a poll to suspend building inspection

Upon motion of Supervisor Presley, seconded by Supervisor Cruvey and adopted by a vote of 5 to 0, with all members present and voting in favor thereof and no one voting against the same, the Tazewell County Board of Supervisors hereby ratifies a poll to suspend building inspection requirements for AEP meter boxes installed in homes which lost power due to Hurricane Helene which were installed subsequent to October 5, 2024 and prior to January 1, 2025, pursuant the Board's October 1, 2024 Emergency Declaration.

Mr. Young advised that this suspension was at the request of AEP, who granted a grace period for inspections provided they were done within the allotted time period to prevent cutoff.

19/460 Corridor

Mr. Young apprised the Board of a RAISE grant to study traffic issues on the US 19/460 corridor. He stated that if recommendations for repairs were made in the study, the study can be used to go back again to US DOT to apply to have some of the issues repaired. Several locations have been targeted as problem areas: the crossover at PM Kwik Mart at Pounding Mill and the multiple entrances to Walmart, being two of them. Mr. Young explained that a public meeting is required to hear comments regarding those safety issues. He suggested that one of the meetings occur during the December 2024 Board meeting and the other by the end of 2024.

Upon motion of Supervisor Hrovatic, seconded by Supervisor Presley and adopted by a vote of 5 to 0, with all members present and voting in favor thereof and no one voting against the same, the Tazewell County Board of Supervisors hereby a public meeting in connection with application for a RAISE grant to study traffic issues on the US 19-460 corridor.

Lease of public meeting room

Mr. Young advised that the public meeting room at the County Administration building is currently leased to FEMA on a temporary basis for their local Disaster Recovery Center.

Upon motion of Supervisor Presley, seconded by Supervisor Cruvey and adopted by a vote of 5 to 0, with all members present and voting in favor thereof and no one voting against the same, the Tazewell County Board of Supervisors hereby ratify a poll to lease the public meeting room to FEMA through December 6, 2024.

Electrical line to Morris Knob

Upon motion of Supervisor Giles pie, seconded by Supervisor Cruvey and adopted by a vote of 5 to 0, with all members present and voting in favor thereof and no one voting against the same, the Tazewell County Board of Supervisors hereby ratifies a poll to permit AEP to reestablish the power lines at Morris Knob at a cost of \$6,800.00.

Payment in lieu of taxes

Mr. Young explained that each year Tazewell County waives the real property taxes on the CPRHA properties as the county's contribution to public housing. He said many grant applications require that the County demonstrate an annual contribution to public housing.

Upon motion of Supervisor Presley, seconded by Supervisor Cruvey and adopted by a vote of 5 to 0, with all members present and voting in favor thereof and no one voting against the same, the Tazewell County Board of Supervisors hereby approves waiving the 2024 real property taxes on properties owned by CPRHA.

Discussion regarding Tazewell SROs

The Chairman directed that this matter be deferred until the December 3, 2024 meeting.

Consider dissolving WSA

Mr. Young explained that the WSA had a special called meeting and voted to dissolve the authority and to turn all remaining funds over to the BOS. The Chairman suggested not to dissolve the authority at this time, citing possible new project through CPPDC that could potentially involve the WSA. The Chairman tabled the issue.

Richmond Legislative visit

Mr. Young asked if any of the Board members were interested in attending the legislative reception and received no positive responses. He did recommend meeting with state agencies at another time.

Additional recovery court funding

As explained by Mr. Young, additional funding has been requested by the recovery court for the purpose of purchasing machines that will provide drug test results within 48 hours, as is now required. The cost of the machines is approximately \$100,000.00. The recovery court administrator has asked that each local county contribute toward the purchase of a machine to facilitate Virginia Tech testing the samples. Supervisor Gillespie stated that if and when a vote is taken, he felt he should abstain because he provides legal representation for defendants and serves on an advisory committee for the recovery court.

Supervisor Hrovatic suggested the funding could come from the opioid settlement funds.

No vote was taken, pending collection of additional information.

Proposed mobile drug treatment units

Mr. Collins shared information regarding mobile drug treatment centers. He expressed concern about the myriads of things that can go wrong with mobile distribution of drug treatment.

Supervisor Cruey shared his objections to the program.

Mr. Young asked for comments and/or suggestions from the Board regarding the meeting schedule for 2025. He advised the proposed dates will be added to the agenda for the December 2024 meeting.

Other

Mr. Young requested that the burn ban be extended for an additional two weeks.

Upon motion of Supervisor Gillespie, seconded by Supervisor Plaster and adopted by a vote of 5 to 0, with all members present and voting in favor thereof and no one voting against the same, the Tazewell County Board of Supervisors hereby approves extending the burn ban until November 21, 2024 if necessary.

The Chairman directed that this matter be deferred to the December 3, 2024 meeting.

Mr. Young stated that there is a member of the IDA that has only attended one meeting. Supervisor Cruey offered to reach out to the member and report back.

Richlands Police Dept 5K

**AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND
THE TAZEWELL COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS FOR FUNDING AND
SERVICES OF THE TAZEWELL COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT**

This agreement ("Agreement") for the services to be provided by the Tazewell County Health Department and the funding therefore is by and between the Virginia Department of Health ("VDH") and Tazewell County Board of Supervisors (collectively "the Parties").

The Agreement is created in satisfaction of the requirements of § 32.1-31 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, in order to operate the Tazewell County Health Department under the terms of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants and agreements in this Agreement, the sufficiency of which is acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows.

§ 1. VDH, over the course of one fiscal year, will pay an amount not to exceed \$1,301,915.00, from the state general fund to support the cooperative budget in accordance with, and dependent upon, appropriations by the General Assembly, and in like time frame, the Board of Supervisors of Tazewell County will provide by appropriation and in equal quarterly payments a sum of \$324,889.00 local matching funds and \$205,084.00 one-hundred percent local funds for a total of \$529,973.00 local funds for this fiscal year.

In addition, the Board of Supervisors has approved the Tazewell County Health Department to carry forward \$0.00 in local matching funds for a total of \$324,889.00 matching funds and an additional \$0.00 in one-hundred percent local funds from the prior fiscal year closing locality balance.

These joint funds will be distributed in timely installments, as services are rendered in the operation of the Tazewell County Health Department, which shall perform public health services in Tazewell County as indicated in Attachment A(1.), and will perform services required by local ordinances as indicated in Attachment A(2.). Payments from the local government are due on the third Monday of each fiscal quarter.

§ 2. The term of the agreement begins July 1, 2024. This Agreement will be automatically extended on a state fiscal year to year renewal basis under the existing terms and conditions of the Agreement unless timely written notice of termination is provided by either party. Such written notice shall be given at least 60 days prior to the beginning of the fiscal year in which the termination is to be effective.

§ 3. The Commonwealth of Virginia ("Commonwealth") and VDH shall be responsible for providing liability insurance coverage and will provide legal defense for state employees of the local health department for acts or occurrences arising from performance of activities conducted pursuant to state statutes and regulations.

A. The responsibility of the Commonwealth and VDH to provide liability insurance coverage shall be limited to and governed by the Commonwealth of Virginia Public Liability Risk Management Plan, established under § 2.2-1837 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended. Such insurance coverage shall extend to the services specified in Attachments A(1.) and A(2.), unless the locality has opted to provide coverage for the employee under the Public Officials Liability Self-Insurance Plan, established under § 2.2-1839 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, or under a policy procured by the locality.

B. The Commonwealth and VDH will be responsible for providing legal defense for those acts or occurrences arising from the performance of those services listed in Attachment A(1.), conducted in the performance of this contract, as provided for under the Code of Virginia and as provided for under the terms and conditions of the Commonwealth of Virginia Public Liability Risk Management Plan.

- C. Services listed in Attachment A(2.), any services performed pursuant to a local ordinance, and any services authorized solely by Title 15.2 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, when performed by a state employee, are herewith expressly exempted from any requirements of legal defense or representation by the Attorney General or the Commonwealth. For purposes of assuring the eligibility of a state employee performing such services for liability coverage under the Commonwealth of Virginia Public Liability Risk Management Plan , the Attorney General has approved, pursuant to § 2.2-507 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, and the Commonwealth of Virginia Public Liability Risk Management Plan , the legal representation of said employee by the city or county attorney, and, the Board of Supervisors of Tazewell County hereby expressly agrees to provide the legal defense or representation at its sole expense in such cases by its local attorney.
- D. In no event shall the Commonwealth or VDH be responsible for providing legal defense or insurance coverage for local government employees.

§ 4. Title to equipment purchased with funds appropriated by the local government and transferred to the Commonwealth, either as match for state dollars or as a purchase under appropriated funds expressly allocated to support the activities of the local health department, will be retained by the Commonwealth and will be entered into the Virginia Fixed Asset Accounting and Control System. Local appropriations for equipment to be locally owned and controlled should not be remitted to the Commonwealth, and the local government's procurement procedures shall apply in the purchase. The locality assumes the responsibility to maintain the equipment and all records thereon.


§ 5. This Agreement may only be amended or otherwise modified by an instrument in writing signed by the Parties.

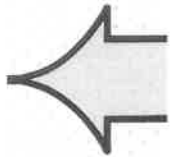
